What Is CQ Researcher?



<u>CQ Researcher Online</u> is an indepth, unbiased information resource with coverage on topics relating to health, social trends, criminal justice, international affairs, education, the environment, technology, and the economy.

Each single-themed, 12,000-word report is researched and written by a professional journalist. It provides the reader with an introductory overview; background and chronology on the topic; an assessment of the current situation; tables and maps; pro/con statements from representatives of opposing positions; and bibliographies of key sources.

CQ Researcher is available through the <u>Libraries Homepage</u>. In the green "Research" box click on the <u>Databases</u> link, then scroll down the alphabetical list or use the link to jump to the "C" section of databases.

ETYMOLOGY:

From Latin sollus (whole), ultimately from the Indo-European root sol- (whole), which brought us solid, salute, save, salvo, soldier, catholicity, salutary, and salubrious + citus, past participle of ciere (to arouse), ultimately from the Indo-European root kei- (to set in motion), which also gave us cinema, kinetic, excite, and resuscitate. Earliest documented use: 1412.

Tech Term: Softphone



A Softphone is a software application on a user's computer that allows them to make "voice over IP" (VoIP) telephone calls as long as they have the appropriate peripheral hardware on hand.

Often a softphone is designed to behave like a traditional telephone, sometimes appearing as an image of a phone, with a display panel and

buttons with which the user can interact. A softphone is usually used with a headset connected to the sound card of the PC, or with a USB phone.
